Environment report	<p><u>Andrew Garratt, Community Liaison Officer, Dalrymple Bay Coal Terminal Pty Ltd:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There were no dust complaints since the last CWG meeting • Andrew delivered the results of two investigated dust complaints (lodged on 9 and 11 January). The results from Bureau Veritas indicated that while coal dust was present, it was not the major component of the dust occurring at the residence. Other components included quartz and rock (sand/dirt/dust) paper, insect and plant fibres. • All of port dust and noise monitoring equipment (new) is still progressing and due for installation in August.

Total funds raised were almost \$100,000 - Provided Alligator Creek School with funding towards the recent vandalism attack - Provided plants for a local environmental project at the Louisa Creek Reserve. Betty Hobbs has also received monetary support from other organisations for the project. - Coal to Coast festival – media launch was successful, featuring in five local and regional papers, one magazine and radio, WIN and 7. Sponsorship packages are expected to be delivered next week. The Committee is meeting regularly to work out programs and allocate space at the showground for the careers marquee, stage and games. The event is on track to achieve 30,000 + visitors to Sarina over the two and a half days. - New public bus service to commence on 15th June, initially on Monday's and Thursday's. This will be a 'use it or lose it' service trialled for the next two years. DBCT P/L is a proud partner and will feature on the bus timetables, posters and the sides of the new distinctive buses. Residents should receive notification of the bus services shortly. - Festival of Arts – this year the festival of arts spreads its wings to Sarina with the Songs of Sarina. DBCT P/L is a proud partner to the Festival of Arts and fully supports its progress into the Sarina District. - Mackay Turtle Watch Project – objective is to minimise harmful light sources during the turtle nesting season. DBCT P/L is supporting this project. Research has indicated that female turtles can become disoriented by light when they come ashore and turtle hatchlings can also become disoriented when they are seeking to make their dash toward the ocean after coming out of the nest.
