Dalrymple Bay Coal Terminal (DBCT) Management	<p><u>Greg Smith, Dalrymple Bay Coal Terminal (DBCT) Management:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Greg Smith updated the CWG regarding Dalrymple Bay Coal Terminal (DBCT) Management's lodgement of an Expression of Interest with North Queensland Bulk Ports Corporation (NQBP) regarding investigating development of an industrial complex at Dudgeon Point. Greg reported that NQBP had delayed its announcement of Preferred Proponents for up to four weeks. If the Preferred Proponents are announced prior to the next CWG meeting, Greg will contact members with an update and next steps. Once announced, feasibility studies (funded by the preferred proponents) would commence. Andrew Mecoles updated the meeting regarding proposed DBCT Management contributions as part of the 7X close-out. The property was visited and the dust was found to be coming from QR wagons prior to entering DBCT Rail Receiving. QR will follow-up the complaint. • A complaint was received from Betty Hobbs regarding an unusual yellow powder throughout her home. Samples were taken and it is being tested. The source is still unknown. Some CWG members suggested it could be a pollen-type dust. • Additional mobile monitoring stations were removed prior to the cyclone. 8.	General business	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ron Faulkner tabled a letter he received from NQBP regarding the bund wall around the DBCT Rail Loop. The letter was in response to Ron's enquiry regarding potentially contaminated water coming from the constructed bund around the DBCT Rail Loop. The letter stated that the bund did contain coal, but that coal was a natural element and does not necessarily make the material "contaminated". Ron stated he would also liaise with DERM to have the material tested. • At the 16 July 2009 CWG meeting, Betty Hobbs advised that the Louisa Creek area had been silting heavily. Betty Hobbs contacted NQBP who asked GHD to undertake a desktop study into this. Betty tabled the report findings at the meeting. According to the report, monitoring results to date indicated compliance with Environmental Authority license conditions and Ambient Air Quality standards. A copy of the full report is attached to these minutes. • Betty Hobbs will continue to update the CWG regarding NQBP's interest regarding future support for the mangrove boulevard. Betty noted that this project needed an injection of enthusiasm.
