8.	DBCT Management Update	<i>Dudgeon Point update</i> Peter – DBCTM is requesting lower capacity, but this is a few of months away. Demand is softer than before and in discussions with NQBP. Master plan needs to remain the same, but the EIS can be altered. EIS will be pushed back significantly.  Question asked about NQBP management for who is who.  Greg – Good news on dust. Changes to terminal regulations. Three strikes and you're out. This means that after three dusty trains the terminal can reject all trains from that mine. Expect this to be in place in about 4 - 5 weeks.  Question asked how do we get Hay Point to do this too?  Test results through for water tanks. Issue with first flush (check with Greg) in report.
