4.	Environment Report	<p>Steve Rae reported on external contacts: noise, dust, water, waste and revegetation since the last meeting. There was 1 external contact from Louisa Creek resident about dust – Investigation found all levels remained within licence limit and Air quality remained in the “Good” category when assessed against the Qld Air Quality Categories.</p> <p>Additional discussion was held, as below.</p> <p>Noise Noise levels during August and September did not exceed the licence limits as reported in the Port of Hay Point Ambient Air Monitoring Report. Data for October is being collated, analysed, and verified for reporting.</p> <p>Dust Dust Deposition and PM10 during August and September did not exceed the licence limits as reported in the Port of Hay Point Ambient Air Monitoring Report. Samples and data for October are being collated, analysed and verified for reporting.</p> <p>Water Water modelling will continue to be undertaken to assess requirement for</p>			

accessing the SunWater allocation in the coming months

No controlled release of water since July 2022, water quality continues to support controlled releases if required. No groundwater pumped.

Waste

Beach clean-ups completed at Louisa Creek and Half-Tide in September. The waste data is being recorded in the AMDI database; the next clean ups are scheduled for December.

Daly Bay and Tangaroa Blue also undertook a beach clean event at Cape Palmerston Beach in October, 23 volunteers covered 10km of beach collecting close to 850kg of waste.

Tom: You do a fantastic job with the beach clean ups, how hard would be to do a roadside clean up?

Steve: We can investigate the possibility of a roadside clean up, based on the level of risk.

Action: Steve to investigate with SRE and report back at next meeting.

Revegetation

Ongoing maintenance of revegetation areas has occurred.

 Another round of fox control was undertaken with local council, with two dens found and treated along the Hay Point foreshore, no active dens found at Louisa Creek

Sustainability

The DBI DBT Sustainability Report 2022 is in the final stages of review and is expected to be published by November 2022.
