4.	Environment Report	 Steve Rae reported on external contacts, noise, dust, water, waste and revegetation since the last meeting. Additional discussion was held, as below. Noise There were zero noise level exceedances reported for all community monitoring stations for June and July. Data for August is still being assessed and verified for reporting. Dust There was 1 Dust Complaint from Louisa Creek Resident 04/09/21 – Currently being investigated. Dust Deposition and PM10 during June and July did not exceed the licence limits as reported in the Port of Hay Point Ambient Air Monitoring Report. Samples and data collected for August are being analysed for reporting. The data collected from the extra dust deposition gauge at Betty Hobbs residence remains below license limit. Water No take of the 500ML SunWater allocation with no take planned for the next month. No controlled releases since January, water quality continues to support controlled releases if required. 			

		Groundwater – 201kL pumped from GW8 for Jun-Aug period to perform yield and performance testing as required under our groundwater licence, pumping for licence requirement to continue into September. Waste Beach clean-ups continue quarterly with Tangaroa Blue recording data in the AMDI database, next is scheduled for September; Tues 14th - Louisa Creek, Wed 15th - Half Tide. Revegetation Anzac Grevillia's planted along the Hay Point Road bund revegetation. Sustainability DBCT P/L is almost at the end of collating end of financial year sustainability data and providing information needed for the Terminal's sustainability report. We look forward to sharing the Sustainability Report that will tell our story and demonstrate our commitment to a sustainable future. Other Black pebbles on Louisa Creek Beach (CWG mention previous meeting) Beach inspection to align with Beach clean-ups in September. Biosecurity The White Colonial Sea Squirt is a colonial ascidian, with a white mucous-like appearance and can overgrow native marine species. It fouls submerged and floating infrastructure and can be introduced via fouling on ship hulls and possibly in ballast water and internal seawater systems. It has been identified for the first time in Queensland at Gulf of Carpentaria, Townsville, Abbot Point, Airlie Beach, Mackay and Brisbane. Therefore, DBCT continues to monitor infrastructure and is working with NQBP and Dept. Agriculture and Fisheries (DAF) to ensure
